Dear Senator Jackson:

I am writing to you on behalf of the Peace and Freedom Party of California which first qualified for the ballot in California over 50 years ago in January 1968. As a socialist party, we are concerned with issues regarding working people. As such, Peace and Freedom Party supports SB 1383.

We believe that all employees should be free from discrimination or fear of being discharged because of childcare purposes covered in these regulations without regard to the number of employees their employer has. Every worker should be covered, not just those in larger organizations. All employees deserve to be treated equally.

We also agree that the 40 hour per year limit shall not apply during states of emergency. However, we do question whether an employee can give notice in all emergency situations. Special circumstances require adjustments of the rules.
