I am writing to you on behalf of the Peace and Freedom Party of California to support SB 260.

The need for action to combat climate change is pressing. This bill would be a small, but significant, step in that direction.

We support SB 260 because it would require large businesses in California to publicly disclose their greenhouse gas emissions in an easily understandable way.

SB 260 would require the state to set up a reporting and registry program and would empower the California Attorney General to seek civil penalties for violations.

While recognizing that AB 260 is just a tiny part of combating global warming, we urge the passage of this bill and its full implementation, and the provision of the necessary funding for the reporting program.
