Subject: AB 11 (Lee) Social Housing Act - Support

Dear Assembly Member Lee:

I am writing on behalf of the Peace and Freedom Party of California in support of AB 11, the Social Housing Act. As you may know, the Peace and Freedom Party has been an advocate for social housing for more than 50 years.

AB 11 would create the California Housing Authority (CHA) to eliminate the gap between housing production and housing needs and preserve affordable housing. We support efforts to provide affordable housing and reduce the profit motive associated with home ownership.

AB 11 establishes two leasing models, a rental model for those who commit to a one-year lease and an ownership model for those who commit to at least a five-year lease. This flexibility would accommodate a mixture of household incomes and protect residents' right to participate in the operation and management of the units where they live.

The Peace and Freedom Party strongly supports the concept of social ownership, and the right of people to have say in the management of their residences.
