Subject: AB 1100 (Low) 32-hour Workweek Pilot Program SUPPORT

Dear Assemblymember Low:

I am writing to you on behalf of the Peace and Freedom Party of California in support of AB 1100

This bill would establish a 32-hour workweek pilot program to give grants to businesses to support a temporary transition to a 32-hour workweek and gain data from employers' reports which include findings and recommendations for expanding the program.

We suggest that AB 1100 be amended to clarify that "no reduction in pay" means no reduction in weekly pay rather than just no reduction in hourly pay, and to require that work over 32 hours in a week be paid at overtime rates.

The Peace and Freedom Party platform calls for a 30-hour work week for 40 hours' pay. AB 1100 is a step towards that goal.
